Written, directed, and edited by James B. Steerman (Professor of Drama and Film, Vassar College) and Rebecca Holderness (Assistant Professor of Theatre, University of Wisconsin, Milwaukee) Ms. Julia is a short, 40-50 minute experimental narrative HD digital movie. The story concerns a relationship between a 36 year old female film professor at a liberal arts college and a 21 year old male student who is serving as the editorial assistant on a film adaptation of August Strindberg's stage play, Miss Julie, that the professor is making. Ms. Julia thus includes scenes from the Miss Julie film, as well as scenes depicting the contemporary relationship between teacher and student, and freely intermixes these two elements. The rough cut will include edited footage, as shot, and basic sound, as recorded on set, etc., but no additional music, sound effects, or sophisticated digital manipulation of picture and sound.
